- A minimum of eight (8) abreast. Ten (10) if room is available. A unit with 250+ members **MUST** march 10 abreast.
- Two (2) officers of each marching unit should bring up the rear.
- The only banners allowed are ones identifying the unit or "England Get Out Of Ireland." Only one banner for each unit. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
- Green hats, sneakers, or other "oddball" dress should be discouraged.
- **No** animals or mascots.
- **No** eating, drinking or smoking in the line of march.
- No displays of any kind will be permitted. DO NOT ASK!!!
- Units should make sure they are I proper formation before approaching Fifth Avenue.
- After units get on Fifth Avenue, no stragglers should be allowed to join the unit. Unit marshals should be on the alert for this at each intersection. <u>Please be vigilant.</u>
